1. OFFICIAL COLOURS, EMBLEM AND APPAREL

- 1.1. The official colours and emblem of Gauteng Cycling are in line with the Gauteng Sports Confederation Provincial Sport Colours regulations.
- 1.2. The official apparel of Gauteng Cycling is in line with the Gauteng Sports Confederation Provincial Sport Colours regulations.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1. "Member" means a Provincial Federation or other which is a member of GSC as per article 14 of the constitution of GSC.
- 2.2. "Gauteng Cycling" by affiliation is a "Member of GSC" and can award "Member colours" into section 15.8 of the Gauteng Sports Confederation Provincial Sport Colours Regulations:
 - 2.2.1. Members are entitled to use their own colours, emblems and insignia which they award and use in their sole discretion. "Member" colours should be used in the case of invitation matches, "B"- and Veteran (Master) - sides, "Development" teams competing against other provinces/countries in friendly matches honorary/long service awards, amongst others.
 - 2.2.2. No member is allowed to use the GSC Emblem, or any combination thereof as member colours purposes of awarding member colours.
 - 2.2.3. **"Provincial colours" are reserved for Inter-Provincial participation only** and reserved for athletes representing Gauteng in competitions at the highest level consistent with the Academy and High Performance System of the Republic.
- 2.3. "Provincial team(s)"- a team of one or more sportsmen and/or sportswomen selected in terms of an approved selection process to represent Gauteng at the highest level, in a sporting contest involving one or more Province(s).

3. APPLICATION FOR COLOURS

Gauteng Cycling can award Gauteng Provincial Colours subject to meeting the application requirements approved by GSC based on the following prerequisites:

- 3.1. Gauteng Cycling facilitates the awarding of Gauteng Provincial Colours to riders who meet the requirements approved by the GSC. Eligibility is subject to the following prerequisites:
- 3.2. The rider must be a South African Citizen.
- 3.3. The rider must reside in Gauteng.
- 3.4. Road, TT and Track: Only riders in possession of a valid CSA membership with Cycling South Africa and belong to an affiliated Gauteng Regional Cycling Club shall be eligible for Provincial Colours. Juniors and upwards are also required to be in possession of a valid Domestic Racing Licence.
- 3.5. MTB: Only riders in possession of a valid CSA membership with Cycling South Africa and belong to an affiliated Gauteng Regional Cycling Club shall be eligible for Provincial Colours. UCI categories (Juniors ; Under-23 ; Elite) are also required to be in possession of a valid Domestic Racing Licence.
- 3.6. BMX: Only riders in possession of a valid CSA membership with Cycling South Africa and belong to an affiliated Gauteng Regional Cycling Club shall be eligible for Provincial Colours. UCI categories (Juniors ; Elite) are also required to be in possession of a valid Domestic Racing Licence.
- 3.7. Riders must not bring the sport into disrepute. This includes, but is not limited to, conduct in person, through the media, on social media, or via any other form of communication. Any rider who does so will be deemed ineligible for selection.

4. QUALIFYING AGE CATEGORIES PER DISCIPLINE

- 4.1. Although Cycling South Africa award colours only once per category, Provincial colours shall be awarded in every year of selection /participation. For Provincial Colours, the following age categories, as acknowledged by Cycling South Africa, and subject to age categories set out in the national discipline handbook shall qualify:
- 4.2. Age Groups U11-U17 or Nipper – Youth (age 8 – 16 years at 31 Dec of every year) – Junior Colours
- 4.3. Age Group Junior and above (age 17 years and older at 31 Dec of every year) – Senior Colours

5. MINIMUM NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS PER AGE CATEGORY

- 5.1. In order to qualify for Provincial Colours, the selection races listed for each discipline, must meet the following number of participants. Age categories may be combined to meet the required minimum number.
- 5.2. Male riders must place as follows:

- 5.2.1. Place in the top 3 with a minimum of 5 participants, OR
- 5.2.2. Place in the top 2 with a minimum of 4 participants, OR
- 5.2.3. Place first with a minimum of 3 participants.
- 5.3. Female riders must place as follows:
 - 5.3.1. Place in the top 3 with a minimum of 4 participants, OR
 - 5.3.2. Place in the top 2 with a minimum of 3 participants, OR
 - 5.3.3. Place first with a minimum of 2 participants.

6. RIDER SUPPORT

- 6.1. Riders selected to represent South Africa at an international event are eligible for financial support of up to R5,000 (five thousand rand) per annum, per discipline. Reimbursement will be made upon submission of valid proof of airline travel and accommodation. All support remains subject to the availability of funds at the time of application.

7. Criteria outside the ambit of the Selection Policy

- 7.1. To avoid misunderstandings and to be fair to all contenders, it must be noted that selection performance criteria, and selection races, are strictly limited to those detailed and listed in this document. Any aspect outside of the ambit of this policy will not be considered in determining selection.

8. Updates to Criteria

- 8.1. Revisions to the Selection Criteria—whether relating to event dates, event listings, Performance Data requirements, or any other component—may occur at any time. Such revisions will be published on the Gauteng MTB Telegram group and the Gauteng Cycling website.

9. QUALIFICATION PER DISCIPLINE

See each discipline listed below:

10. Introduction And Purpose

- 10.1. This policy aims to provide selection performance criteria to athletes who want to be part of their Provincial Team and represent the province at the respective Inter-Provincial event.
 - 10.1.1. The selection of riders to the Provincial Teams, is strategic in that the aim is to send riders with the realistic potential to achieve the targets set out below.
 - 10.1.2. The objective is thus also to recognize the achievements of riders at the highest level, and to enhance, maintain and protect the status of merit-based Provincial Team Selection over time and that riders who do not meet selection standards will not be selected.
 - 10.1.3. National experience needs to be gained with participation in the SA Series races in South Africa.
- 10.2. It is very important to understand that, by a rider meeting the performance criteria set out in this document, s/he will not automatically qualify for inclusion in Provincial Team. In addition, a selection process and panel approval will also be required and only riders who meet the targets set out in this policy and are approved by the selection panel, will be eligible for selection.
 - 10.2.1. The selection panel shall determine that qualifying riders are at the performance level required to be competitive at Inter-Provincial level.
 - 10.2.2. Riders deemed non-competitive can be excluded from selection.
- 10.3. A test for competitiveness will be conducted to assess:
 - 10.3.1. A rider's head-to-head performance against other RSA riders, in the same category.
 - 10.3.2. Rider's performance can also be compared with others who are ranked in the Top 30 in the current SA Rankings for the respective discipline.

11. Purpose of Policy

- 11.1. To enable riders to prepare, train and schedule for the upcoming 2026 racing season, and for their potential selection to provincial teams, it is essential that clear guidelines and targets are set out for them to work to.

12. Eligibility for selections

- 12.1. The general requirements for selections are set out in the CyclingSA Selection Regulations and Policy Framework 2024 – 2028. These amongst others include:
 - 12.1.1. Be a South African Citizen.
 - 12.1.2. Hold a valid South African passport.
 - 12.1.3. Meet the UCI requirements in terms of citizenship, particularly in cases where dual citizenship comes into question.
 - 12.1.4. Riders may only enter and race as a South African citizen, in all races during the season.

12.1.5. Have a “full racing” Cycling SA license or UCI International License, with nationality recorded as RSA, by the start of the season, or first selection race if earlier, for Juniors and Elites.

12.1.6. Never bring the sport into disrepute. This includes, but is not limited to, both in person and/or via the media, social media and/or other forms of communication. Said athlete will not be eligible for selections.

12.2. Participate in the 2026 Provincial Championships in the specific discipline.

12.2.1. Riders meeting this selection criteria can apply for exemption from riding the Provincial Championships, but a request to the Provincial MTB Commission will only be considered if the rider is considered a realistic Top 5 contender at the SA Champs. This concession is not automatic and must be approved first.

12.2.2. If exempted, the rider must still meet the Selection Criteria and compete in as many of the other selection events as deemed necessary in order to meet said requirements.

13. Extenuating Circumstances

13.1. The criteria and process to consider selection under extenuating circumstances are outlined in the Cycling South Africa Selection Regulations and Policy Framework.

14. Rider responsibilities

14.1. It is the personal responsibility of contending riders to establish the dates and venues of the races and series listed as selection races as these may change.

14.1.1. DNF and DNS:

14.1.1.1. The onus is on the rider who believe themselves to be eligible for selection for the team to provide the selectors with reasons for a DNS or DNF at selection races.

14.1.1.2. Reasons to be provided in writing within 48 hours of the selection race.

14.1.1.3. The only allowable reasons for a DNS and-or DNF will be illness or mechanical breakdown. Mechanical problems can only be used as a reason once during the season.

14.1.1.4. Once a rider has started the race, illness cannot be used as a reason for poor performance.

14.2. Long-term layoff due to injury or illness:

14.2.1. Where a rider suffers an injury or illness which requires more than 3-months recuperation, they can be excused from selection races during their recovery period.

14.2.2. The rider's results in selection events prior / post the layoff period will be taken into consideration however, the rider still needs to meet the Selection Criteria and must be deemed competitive when assessing head-to-head performance.

14.3. All rider correspondence to be addressed to the MTB Chairperson in Gauteng.

15. Provincial Selection Panel 2026

- 15.1. MTB Commission in each province will serve as the provincial selectors panel

16. Selection timelines

- 16.1. Provincial Series events applicable to each discipline.

17. Minimum number of participants

- 17.1. Male riders must place as follows:
- 17.1.1. Place in the top 3 with a minimum of 5 participants, OR
 - 17.1.2. Place in the top 2 with a minimum of 4 participants, OR
 - 17.1.3. Place first with a minimum of 3 participants.
- 17.2. Female riders must place as follows:
- 17.2.1. Place in the top 3 with a minimum of 4 participants, OR
 - 17.2.2. Place in the top 2 with a minimum of 3 participants, OR
 - 17.2.3. Place first with a minimum of 2 participants.

18. Team selection will focus on:

- 18.1. XCO [Cross Country Olympic]
- 18.2. XCC [Cross Country Short Course]
- 18.3. DHI [Downhill Individual]
- 18.4. XCM [Marathon Cross Country]
- 18.5. EDR [Enduro]
- 18.6. GRV [Gravel]
- 18.7. SCMTB [Schools Cycling MTB]
- 18.8. PUM [Pump Track]

19. Age Categories applicable to CSA events – age as of 31 December 2026

22. Diversity Representation

- 22.1. Since the transformation and development plans and implementation of CyclingSA-MTB are behind that of many other sports in South Africa, we will apply a quota system to ensure we fast-track and afford PDI mountain bikers the best possible opportunity to develop into world-class mountain bikers.
- 22.2. While meeting selection and performance criteria will determine final squad sizes, the target will be to achieve a 25% PDI representation in teams. Such inclusion is:
 - 22.2.1. Within the targets set at above, those PDI riders achieving the best overall results in selection races across all categories will be considered for selection.
 - 22.2.2. If no PDI riders meet the selection and performance criteria, the selection committee can include the best performing PDI riders as part of the SA team. It must be noted that this will not be at the expense of any other qualifying rider.

23. Age Category and applicable Inter-Provincial event for each discipline

- 23.1. The Team Selection Criteria will be used to select the teams to represent the Province at the following events.
- 23.2. Inter-Provincial events are age specific. Match your age and discipline in the tables 1-5 below for the respective Inter-Provincial events.

- 23.3. If a province cannot complete their series before the Inter-Provincial, riders who competed in the Inter-Provincial and who meet the criteria at the end of the series, will be awarded colours. Those who did not compete in the inter-provincial, will not qualify for colours.

26. Performance Criteria for XCC, XCO, EDR, DHI, GRV, XCM, PUM

26.1. The Performance Criteria is set out below incorporates Provincial Cups and Champs, with specific targets outlined to be considered for Inter-Provincial selections. In all cases below:

26.1.1. Where finish positions are taken into account, results where riders do not finish on the same number of laps as the winner, will not be considered.

26.1.2. Performance levels are assessed based on the race category winner's time [i.e. head-to-head performance; Men assessed against Men; Women against Women]. Percentage time from the winner varies and is event specific.

- 26.1.3. All Provincial events are weighted at 100% (where 100% equates to one point).
Provided the rider is within the required percentage time from the winner, the rider will attain one point.

27. MTB Inter-Provincial Events

- 27.1. See list under section 25 for each specific MTB discipline.

28. Points

- 28.1. Riders must attain a minimum of three points on the Performance Data, during the selection period in order to be considered for the Long List. Long List does not equate to selection.
- 28.2. Riders who meet the minimum points required will be noted on the Long List. This is the minimum criteria required to be considered for selections.
- 28.3. Being on the Long List does not confirm selections. The Selectors Panel will confirm the final list of the top performing riders based off the individual performance and available slots, if applicable.

29. Rider Long Lists

- 29.1. To encourage ongoing achievement and to facilitate early talent identification, riders at various levels of development in their cycling careers will be able to view their performance and standings on the Performance Data. This data will be released on a regular basis throughout the season.
- 29.2. Riders who meet the minimum number of points will be noted on the Long List.
- 29.3. **Long List does not equate to selection.**
- 29.4. The Selectors Panel is responsible for assessing the individual performance of all riders on the Long List and ascertain which riders will be noted on the Short List and Final List.
- 29.5. For the Short List, riders with more points are ranked higher.
- 29.6. For riders with the same points, the total Score, further ranks the riders.
- 29.7. For riders with the same Points and Score, the individual UCI ranking at the time of selection, further ranks the riders.

30. Provincial Champs

- 30.1. The Provincial Champs is compulsory and will be weighted at 100%.

31. Minimum participation

- 70.2. While meeting selection and performance criteria will determine final squad sizes, the target will be to achieve a 25% PDI representation in teams. Such inclusion is:
 - 70.2.1. Within the targets set at above, those PDI riders achieving the best overall results in selection races across all categories will be considered for selection.
 - 70.2.2. If no PDI riders meet the selection and performance criteria, the selection committee can include the best performing PDI riders as part of the SA team. It must be noted that this will not be at the expense of any other qualifying rider.
